Strategic Improvement Plan

Our new School Plan 2021-2024 has been published on the school website <https://lanecove-p.schools.nsw.gov.au/about-our-school/school-planning-and-reporting.html>

This working document details the steps we will take to improve learning outcomes and the achievement and growth of all students.

The focus of our school improvement is listed under three strategic directions:

1. Student Growth and Attainment
2. Systemic Explicit Feedback and Collaboration
3. Student Wellbeing through Social and Emotional Learning

We will work together as a school community to ensure students and staff are supported.

Got It - Wellbeing Program

During the second half of the staff 'Got It' training last week, staff once again participated in valuable activities, role plays and discussions.

Two main "take aways" were:

1) All emotions are okay, but not all behaviours are okay:

Everyone has the right to feel and experience different kinds of emotion. In today's society it is important to understand that people react differently to similar events. Therefore, every emotion we experience is okay BUT we cannot accept all behaviours that come from these emotions. As teachers, parents and carers we need to educate and support students to recognise these emotions and give them strategies so that the "not okay" behaviours do not surface.

2) The importance of empathy:

Empathy "helps us to understand and connect with the emotions another person is experiencing. Empathy helps children (and adults) to feel calm and helps to develop a trusting and respectful relationship between teacher and child." (Got It Program)

NAPLAN Timetable- Year 3 and 5 Students

Between 11 and 21 May 2021, students in Year 3 and 5 will participate in NAPLAN Online. Students do not need to be computer experts to take the NAPLAN test online. There are 4 tests that every child will sit.

- Writing (Year 3 on paper. ***Please note Year 5 will do the writing test online***)
- Reading (Year 3 and 5 online)
- Language Conventions (Year 3 and 5 online)
- Numeracy (Year 3 and 5 online)

The **timetable** for NAPLAN is below. Please avoid making appointments for your child during this time. If your child misses a test we will endeavour to have them catch up but this may not always be possible as tests have to be completed in the correct order.

NAPLAN Online – information for parents and carers

Your child will do the NAPLAN tests online

Federal, state and territory education ministers agreed that all schools will gradually transition from the current paper-based NAPLAN to NAPLAN Online in order to provide a better and more precise assessment that is more engaging for students.

State and territory education authorities will determine when their schools move online. The current plan is for all schools to transition to NAPLAN Online by 2022.

One of the main benefits of NAPLAN Online is tailored (or adaptive) testing, in which the test presents questions of higher or lower complexity depending on a student's performance.

Tailored (or adaptive) testing is designed to assess a wider range of student abilities and to measure student achievement more precisely. Your child should not be concerned if they find questions more challenging than usual; they may be taking a more complex test pathway. A student's overall NAPLAN score is based on the number and complexity of questions they answer correctly.

Why do students do NAPLAN?

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life.

Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

The assessment provides parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process – it does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance.

NAPLAN also provides schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are achieving important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

What does NAPLAN assess?

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through their regular school curriculum. All government and non-government education authorities have contributed to the development of NAPLAN materials.

Students are assessed on the same literacy and numeracy curriculum content, regardless of whether they complete the tests online or on paper. Results for both formats can be reported on the same NAPLAN assessment scale.

What can I do to support my child?

On its own, NAPLAN is not a test that can be studied for and students are not expected to do so.

You can support your child by reassuring them that NAPLAN is just one part of their school program, and by reminding them on the day to simply do their best.

ACARA does not recommend excessive preparation for NAPLAN or the use of services by coaching providers.

Ensuring students are familiar with using devices, typing on them and navigating through programs is a part of student learning and a requirement of the Australian Curriculum from the first year at school.

NAPLAN Online is not a test of keyboard skills. There are variations in how fast and well a student can type – just as there are variations in how fast and well a student can write by hand. Year 3 students will complete the writing test on paper.

Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests and will provide appropriate support and guidance.

Participation in NAPLAN

All students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 are expected to participate in the annual NAPLAN assessment. Students with disability may qualify for adjustments that reflect the support normally provided for classroom assessments. You should discuss the use of any adjustments for your child with your child's teacher.

A student with a disability that severely limits their capacity to participate in the assessment, or a student who has recently arrived in Australia and has a non-English speaking background, may be granted a formal exemption.

Your school principal and your local test administration authority can give you more information on special provisions or the process required to gain a formal exemption.

What if my child is absent from school on NAPLAN days?

Where possible, schools may arrange for individual students who are absent at the time of testing to complete missed tests at another time during the school's test schedule.

NAPLAN Online timetable

The assessment window for NAPLAN Online is nine days instead of the three days provided for the paper test. This is to give schools flexibility in scheduling and accommodate schools that may have fewer devices.

The NAPLAN Online assessment window starts on Tuesday 11 May and finishes on Friday 21 May 2021.

The online test scheduling requirements are detailed in the table below.

Writing	Year 3 students do a paper-based writing test (on day 1 only). Year 5 must start on day 1 (schools must prioritise completion of writing across days 1 and 2 only). Numeracy	To be completed after the conventions of language test.	Year 3: 45 min. Year 5: 50 min. Year 7: 55 min. Year 9: 55 min.	This test assesses number and algebra, measurement and geometry, and statistics and probability.

How is my child's performance reported?

Individual student performance is shown on a national achievement scale for each assessment. A result at the national minimum standard indicates that the student has demonstrated the basic literacy and numeracy skills needed to participate fully in that year level.

A NAPLAN individual student report will be issued by your child's school later in the year. If you do not receive a report, you should contact your child's school.

How are NAPLAN test results used?

- Students and parents may use individual results to discuss progress with teachers.
- Teachers use results to better identify students who would benefit from greater challenges or extra support.
- Schools use results to identify strengths and areas to improve in teaching programs, and to set goals in literacy and numeracy.
- School systems use results to review programs and support offered to schools.
- The community can see average school NAPLAN results at myschool.edu.au.

ICAS Assessments Years 3-6



Lane Cove Public School will once again be participating in the ICAS assessments for Years 3 to 6. ICAS is designed to target students' higher-order thinking and problem-solving skills in English, Mathematics, Science and Spelling. All ICAS assessments will be held in Term 3.

ICAS Assessments are now online, a move that reflects a sector-wide transition to computer-based assessment. This allows greater accessibility for students and faster delivery of results.

These globally renowned assessments give students the opportunity to challenge themselves and receive recognition for academic achievement. The assessments are suitable for students wishing to extend themselves academically and take up the personal challenge of competing in an international assessment.

The first P&C General Meeting for Term 2 was held last Tuesday 27 April, via Zoom. We had a very good turnout. There was a robust discussion about the plans for the Hall. As always, the P&C meeting allowed the school community to express their opinions about the process.

The members present voted to fund extra support time for children particularly affected academically by the COVID lockdown, as well as to support professional development in Visible Learning for the wider teaching staff. Miss Morgan and Ms Myors both spoke positively about the benefits that are expected

to flow from this whole school Professional Development. In total, the P&C will put \$50,000 into these two areas. We have also paid for AstroTurf for the new playground near the Canteen - the \$33,000 for this was obtained via a grant from the NSW Government. Thank you to Myles Davis and David Roberts for applying for this grant.

The P&C exists in part to support the school with extra funding in this way - you can help us help Lane Cove Public School by choosing to pay the P&C Voluntary contribution part of the School Fees that were sent home in Term 1, if you are able. This year we will NOT be asking for extra contributions in Term 3, as we have done in the past.

It was decided that we will continue with the Zoom format for the next two General meetings, then hold a face-to-face P&C General meeting in September.

The traditional Mothers' Day Stall will be held on Thursday 6 and Friday 7 May - thank you to the volunteers running the stall, particularly Franki Meijer and Merryn Byrne for organising this. Happy Mothers' Day to the mothers, carers and special people in our childrens' lives.
