# Terry - Principal's Report:

#### ONLINE LEARNING

- LCPS providing regular updates electronically
- 5% arriving each day 38-44 children
- School encouraging children remaining at home
- Where this is not possible children will be welcomed at school as per government guidelines
- Mostly K-2 children All classes operating out of Osborne Park and Terminus
- Push from department to encourage more staff working from home
- Most staff working from home
- Using casuals as much as possible to keep them employed
- Stressful for all lots of change
- Staff positive energing showing through
- Long term positive effect on teaching in this new way
- Google classroom was always in the school plan. This has made us accelerate that process
- LCPS asked for feedback from parents this week
- Wellbeing side of things fairly positive
- I hour of core learning and additional activities as appropriate for families.
- Technology 10 devices loaned out to families, 2 dongles
- Teachers planning for Term 2 but Terry very keen they have a break these holidays
- ? using Zoom with the children government has provided guidelines. Privacy issues, teachers confidence levels. EALD staff trialling it first.

- Terry very grateful for the support from the community and staff
- Term 2 looking like the same. 90 days of social distancing.
