#### Agenda item 3: Victor Tan, Relieving Principal, Principal's Report.

- The School Improvement Plan 2021-2024 was circulated and reviewed leading into a
  discussion around key points of interest. Principal explained his plan to include the entire
  school community in developing a vision for the future of the school and encouraged the
  council to voice opinions onto vision boards. Students and P&C members will be similarly
  encouraged to participate in this vision board to help inform future directions for the school.
- The LCPS Annual Report will be published at the start of Term 3 and will include feedback from the wider school community (via TTFM survey).

## Agenda item 4: Discussion topics.

- City Country Alliance Deputy debriefed council on visit to Gol Gol and plans for teacher
  exchanges and student trips for next year. Will include teacher training to embed, in a genuine
  way, the value of this alliance to the culture of the school and understanding of indigenous
  culture. Suggestions made for possible connections to other local schools (i.e. Riverview) who
  have similar commitment to indigenous culture and programmes to explore for future.
- Music Programme P&C President reviewed current situation with music programme and lower enrolments of students. Discussed ways to make this programme shine again, through showcasing the student groups, through Bang Blow Scrape and Music Camp. Needs focus and profile to resume student enrolments to pre Covid numbers. SC confirmed commitment to ensuring future growth of the music programme as a key part of LCPS.
- School Aesthetics confirmed progression through council approval processes of new electronic school signs. Should be installed in coming months. Discussed new kindergarten playground and school grounds development in conjunction with school build. SC commitment

to ensure school grounds are improved and developed to represent the diverse backgrounds within our community (eg murals, garden improvements, longer term post site development).
